Committee Election

Committee Nominations Open for LAA #3

Nominations of candidates for the Farm Service Agency county committee election representing producers in Local Administrative Area (LAA) number 3 will be accepted through August 1, 2011. Producers who are eligible to vote in LAA 3 and who participate or cooperate in an FSA program and are of legal voting age may be nominated to serve on the county committee. Individuals may nominate themselves or others as candidates. Organizations representing socially disadvantaged minorities and women farmers or ranchers may also nominate candidates. Beginning farmers and ranchers are encouraged to nominate themselves and participate in the election process.

Laramie County FSA will be holding an election for a person to represent LAA 3. That position is currently held by Mark Child. LAA 3 includes all of Laramie County west of County Road 136.

Nomination form FSA-669 A is attached for you to fill out and submit for LAA #3.

Ballots will be mailed to eligible voters by November 4, and must be returned to the FSA county office or postmarked by Dec. 5, 2011.

All farmers, ranchers and other agricultural producers are encouraged to participate. The county committee provides local input on commodity price support loans and payments; establish allotment and yields; conservation programs; disaster assistance payments and other programs. Conservation Reserve Program

Continuous CRP Signup

Laramie County's total CRP acreage has dropped below 25 percent of the total cropland in the county. This allows the County to be eligible for Continuous CRP. The Continuous CRP allows eligible producers to enroll small acreages of eligible cropland or marginal pastureland into the CRP. Participants agree to establish approved conservation practices (farmstead windbreaks, living snow fences, etc.) and remove land from agriculture production in return for annual rental payments for 10 – 15 years. Participants can receive 50% of the cost to establish the practices along with a 40% cost share incentive payment and a one-time signup incentive payment. Please call for an appointment.

Maturing CRP Contracts

CRP participants with expiring contract acres in the final year of the CRP-1, who intend to destroy cover for preparation for spring or fall-seeded crops, need pre-authorization from FSA to avoid penalty. Authorization can only be granted after a completed CRP-1G (Modification to Allow Early Preparation) is reviewed and approved by a representative of the Commodity Credit Corporation and the producer completes a conservation plan with NRCS.

CRP Acreage Reports

CRP acreage is required to be reported annually by filing a crop acreage report by July 1.

Oil Exploration on CRP and Cropland

Oil exploration is being conducted in Laramie County. CRP contracts require permission from the Laramie County FSA Committee prior to any action taking place on the CRP acreage. This includes any seismic exploration and test wells being erected. Failure to notify FSA prior to disturbing the cover could jeopardize the continuation of the contract and could result in penalties. If a well becomes permanent, FSA requires repayment of all rental payments, cost share for grass establishment, interest plus liquidated damages on the area taken out of CRP for oil structures.

Please notify FSA if any cropland is taken out of production (This would include buildings, wind generators, feedlots, oil wells, etc.). We will need to adjust your cropland acres for a correct crop report. This could potentially affect your crop acreage base and your payments made on your farm.

Farm Program Information

2011 Direct & Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) and Agriculture Conservation Revenue Enhancement (ACRE)

Signup

Signup for the 2011 DCP/ACRE will be held now through June 1, 2011. You can request an advance payment of 22 percent. Please call for an appointment.

June 1, 2011, is the deadline for all ACRE and DCP participants. Deputy Administrator Farm Programs has authorized a late file DCP Contract enrollment period through August 1.

The ACRE Option

The Average Crop Revenue Election Program (ACRE) provides a safety net based on state revenue losses and acts in place of the price-based safety net of counter-cyclical payments under DCP. A farm's payment is based on a revenue guarantee calculated using a 5-year average state yield and the most recent 2-year national price for each eligible commodity.

An ACRE payment is issued when both the state and the farm have incurred a revenue loss. In exchange for participating in ACRE, a farm's direct payment is reduced by 20 percent, and marketing assistance loan rates are reduced by 30 percent.

The decision to enroll in the ACRE Program is irrevocable. The owner of the farm and all producers on the farm must agree to enroll in ACRE. Once enrolled, the farm shall be enrolled for that initial crop year and will remain in ACRE through the 2012 crop year.

Acreage Reports

Please file a crop report. Call for an appointment. The deadline is July 1, 2011, so don't wait until the last minute! Late filed acreage reports will cost a minimum of \$46 per farm.

Farm Record Changes

June 1, 2011 is the deadline to provide changes to your farm records at the local FSA office for the 2011 crop year. If you are changing your operation entity type, adding or dropping cropland or farms, or adding entities to your operation, contact the FSA county office by June 1.

Fruit and Vegetable (FAV) Planting

Participating DCP and ACRE farms are limited to the amount of FAV's that can be planted without a payment reduction/violation. FAV acres may not exceed the non-contract acres on the farm. Farms must have a FAV history on the farm or the producer must have a history of producing FAV to be eligible for planting FAV on base acres.

FAV's include dry beans, potatoes, onions and chicory. Planting FAV can cause you to lose benefits and could also include fines. Please contact the office before planting so we can keep you from losing benefits and avoid penalty.

DCP Cover Requirements

Fallow acreage on cropland that supports DCP base acres must be protected from wind and water erosion and have the weeds controlled. Violations for not controlling weeds and wind or water erosion will lead to penalties.

Prevented Planting / Failed Acreage

A Notice of Loss form, CCC-576, should be filed if you have crops that were prevented from being planted or acreage that has failed. For losses on crops covered by NAP or crop insurance, a CCC-576 must be filed within 15 days of the date of the loss or when the loss became apparent. Prevented plantings should be filed within 15 days of the final planting date for the crop.

Disaster Programs

Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP)

Losses of livestock due to adverse weather must be reported to the FSA Office within 30 days of when the loss is apparent by filing a Notice of Loss application FSA-914. For 2011 a Notice of Loss filed must be finalized by October 31, 2011 as this is the last year of this program in the current Farm Bill.

Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments (SURE) Program

Signup for the SURE Program for 2009 crop losses started on January 10. The signup goes through July 29, 2011. Please call for an appointment.

At a minimum, to be eligible for the SURE Program, the producer must have purchased or be enrolled in the following for the 2009 crop year (This is called the Risk Management Purchase Requirement or RMPR):

- A plan of crop insurance of at least catastrophic (CAT) level for all insurable crops on all farms.
- And/or Non-insured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) coverage for all non-insurable crops on all farms.
