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**FOREWORD**

Beet processors, cane processors, and cane refiners in the United States are required by the Federal Agriculture Improvement and Reform Act of 1996, as amended, to report data on physical quantities of stocks, production, imports, sales, and inventory adjustments to the Farm Service Agency (FSA) on a monthly basis. These data are compiled to produce the monthly Sweetener Market Data (SMD) report. Commercial sugar users, distributors, and traders are not required to report their stocks, imports, or exports data.

- Regions on table 8 are defined as:

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## NOTES

- 1) **New Cane Refiner.** A new cane refiner recently began reporting to the Farm Service Agency, retroactively beginning with the month of October, 2009. Since the new cane refiner had beginning stocks, receipts, imports, deliveries, and ending stocks, etc., all of the statistics for every month in FY 2010 have been revised.
  
- 2) **Repeat Notice of Sugar Import and Deliveries Revision.** (The January SMD continues a revision made pursuant to this note in the December 2009 Sweetener Market Data report.) The December 2009 Sweetener Market Data (SMD) is revised herein because the previously reported estimates of raw and refined sugar imports, and sugar food use deliveries by non-reporters were incorrect. The procedure implemented in October 2009 for estimating these items, discussed in the September 2009 Sweetener Market Data, estimates trader (non-reporter) imported sugar sales to refiners by subtracting cane processors' raw sugar sales from cane refiners' raw sugar purchases. We assumed that reported raw sugar purchases would always be higher than raw sugar sales, the difference being the raw sugar sales by traders (non-reporters). Unfortunately, the reporting to USDA by cane processors of raw sugar sales does not coincide perfectly with the reporting to USDA by refiners of their raw sugar purchases from cane processors. For December 2009, reported raw sugar sales by cane processors were much larger, 84,026 tons, than reported raw sugar purchases by cane refiners. Thus, for December 2009, our new method estimated a negative number for trader (non-reporter) raw sugar sales, an unreasonable result. This negative number falsely reduced raw sugar imports, increased refined sugar imports, and increased food use deliveries. The revision reported today is the result of modifying our process to prevent the use of a negative estimate of trader (non-reporter) raw sugar sales.

However, the Farm Service Agency is still not satisfied with the modified algorithm to estimate trader (non-reporter) sugar sales in the SMD and will continue to examine other modifications to the current process.

- 3) **FY 2009 Beet Production Revision.** In order to be consistent with both historical and current year data series, beet production for FY 2009 has been revised to restore the treatment of beet thick juice as 'sugar'. ## JANUARY 2010 SUGAR MARKET REVIEW

### Monthly Summary:

Beginning stocks in January are less than a year ago by 450,872 STRV. Total production is up by 130,903 STRV, with beet sugar production up 3,315 STRV and cane sugar production up 127,589 STRV from a year ago. Total imports are down by 12,487 STRV. Total supply is down by 332,456 STRV from last January.

Total deliveries in January are down slightly by 9,926 STRV than a year ago. Deliveries for domestic human consumption are down 12,671 STRV. Total sales for export are up by 93 STRV from a year ago. Total use is down 2,169 STRV from January 2009. Ending stocks are down 330,288 STRV from a year ago.

### Fiscal Year (FY) to Date Summary:

Total FY 2010 production to date is up 137,471 STRV with beet sugar production up 128,350 STRV and raw cane sugar production up by 9,125 STRV. Total imports are down by 133,488 STRV, refined imports are down by 115,858 for the same period last FY. Total supply is down 129,420 STRV from FY 2009.

Cumulative sales for exports are up by 14,111 STRV, compared to the same period last FY. Total FY deliveries to date are up 72,519 STRV. Deliveries for domestic human consumption are up 63,250 STRV from last FY. Total FY use is up by 200,870 STRV from the same period in FY 2009.
